2. SIG20/26 biennial conference 2020: Updates



Our next SIG20 biennial conference will be jointly organized with SIG26 and will take place on August 26th-28th, 2020 at Utrecht, the Netherlands.

At this point, we would like to remind you that the submission system for our Joint EARLI SIG 20 and SIG 26 conference has opened on January 13th, 2020. You can submit your JURE paper or JURE poster until March 31st, 2020.

2. EARLI conference 2021: Keynote suggestions



After a successful conference in Aachen including a thought-provoking and well-received Invited Symposium on "Epistemic Tools for Inquiry", we are now moving forward towards the EARLI 2021 conference, which will be hosted and organised by the University of Gothenburg.

Our SIG has been invited to provide a shortlist of maximum 3 invited speakers (name, nationality, institute and field of expertise) for the EARLI conference 2021.

In this context, we would like to invite you to share with us your suggestions about potential invited speakers who could represent our SIG no later than Monday, March 2nd, 2020.

The final decision on the invited speakers is taken by the International Scientific Programme Committee and the Executive Committee of EARLI, having a first meeting on March 24th 2020. The decision will be finalised and the selected keynote speakers will be contacted after this meeting.

For the next JURE Pre-Conference, taking place in August 22-23, 2021 in Gothenburg, the EARLI office is launching a call for members of the International Organising Committee (IOC) which consists out of 6-8 junior researchers.

As such, organising a JURE pre-conference offers an authentic training in conference organising and management. You will also be working together with peers from all over Europe, allowing for an interesting exchange between colleagues and great networking opportunities! And, of course, it is great fun to be part of the organising committee! Please be advised that you will need your supervisor's permission before applying.
